The Women's Foundation of Colorado Announces Nearly \$1 Million in 2016 Grants

DENVER (*Feb. 9, 2017*) — Today, <u>The Women's Foundation of Colorado</u> (WFCO) announced that in 2016 it awarded more than \$941,000 in grants to help women and girls on their paths to economic self-sufficiency. WFCO's strategic statewide grantmaking program funded 32 organizations throughout Colorado. Other sources, including donor-advised funds held at WFCO; Beyond Our Borders, a group-advised fund held at WFCO; and the Girls' Leadership Council funded an additional 36 organizations in Colorado and beyond.

In alignment with The Foundation's 2012-2016 strategic plan, the strategic statewide grantmaking program supports several strategies to help women and girls reach economic self-sufficiency, including:

- Keeping girls in school, so they are prepared for college or career
- Helping single moms succeed through job training and education
- Paving the way for women and girls to enter, succeed, and advance in STEM fields
- Developing girls as leaders to drive change in their own communities
- Creating systemic change through public policy and advocacy

"The Women's Foundation of Colorado uses research, public policy and advocacy, and grantmaking together to maximize our impact on the economic advancement of women and girls across the state," said Lauren Y. Casteel, president and CEO of The Women's Foundation of Colorado. "While much of our work is done at the statewide level with lawmakers, many of our grantees also provide critical, on-the-ground support for women who are trying to meet the basic needs of their families right now."
